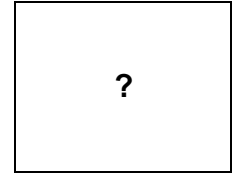
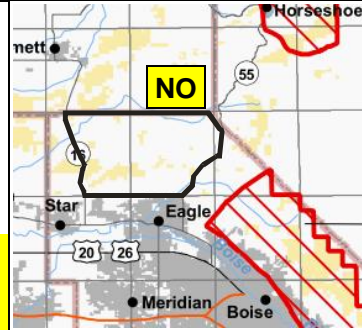

Alternative A: No Action

- Theme:**
- Current resource management, plans, laws, regulations, and policies
 - Alternative against which other alternatives are compared

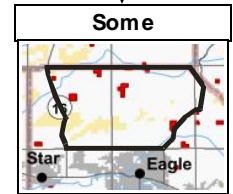
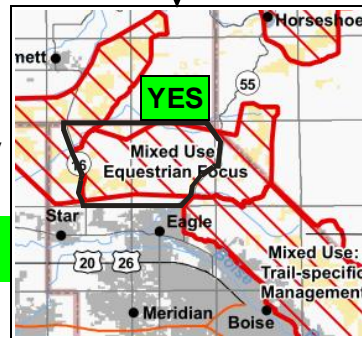
- Foothills Lands:**
- NOT designated within Special Recreation Management Area
 - NOT specifically protected?



Alternative B: Emphasize Resource Conservation

- Themes:**
- Conserve optimum amount of natural resources
 - Designate seasonal, motorized access restrictions in important wildlife habitat
 - Most restrictive related to granting rights-of-way or other developments

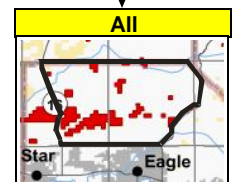
- Foothills Lands:**
- Designated within Special Recreation Management Area
 - Some parcels (see map) candidate for disposal or trade



Alternative C: Accommodate Demand for Public Uses

- Themes:**
- Accommodate growing demand for community expansion, extractive resources use (gravel, stone, etc.) and recreation
 - Least restrictive related to granting rights-of-way or other developments; accommodates commercial and "community priorities"

- Foothills Lands:**
- NOT Designated within Special Recreation Management Area
 - All parcels (see map) candidate for disposal or trade (to agencies or private parties)



Alternative D: BLM Management Efficiency

- Themes:**
- "Block up" (consolidate) BLM ownership into fewer, larger tracts
 - Similar to Alternative B in management emphasis

- Foothills Lands:**
- Designated within Special Recreation Management Area
 - Few, if any (see map) parcels candidate for disposal or trade
